

Supplemental Information

1. Number of people to be served at the site

We will limit the maximum number of vehicles to three. We will start with two and as time passes allow a third vehicle. As we are allowing cars, pickups, vans or class B RV's (camper vans) to be used as sleeping quarters, three to eight Guests could be welcomed. The maximum number of Guests would be eight in total.

2. Hours of Operation

The hours of Guest occupancy would be 6 pm to 8 am *though hours may be modified for Guests according to their work schedule*. Guests participating in the SOS program will have to be off property at other hours, unless the Guests are attending our worship service or other activities/programs which are open to the public.

3. Security — open or closed site

This will be an open site. There will not be a gate or fence that would be locked. This “sheltering” will be in the church parking lot and Guests can be present during designated hours. The parking lot is illuminated at night for safety/security reasons. Guests will have a visible placard to indicate that they are authorized to stay on the KoK property.

There will be a group of volunteers who will be trained in Non-Violent Crisis Intervention Training and who will serve, perhaps one week at a time, to be “on call” and will come to KoK to help with any conflicts or problems that arise.

We will be meeting with the Clackamas County Sheriff's Dept. to alert them of this project. **We have notified them and they do not anticipate problems other than the normal challenges that occur in any neighborhood and will respond as they do to any 911 or non-emergency call.**

We are hiring a security company to perform random overnight patrols as long as we deem necessary.

Guests will have a background check before acceptance into this program to determine past felony criminal convictions involving personal assault and/or sexual assault that might exclude them from the SOS program.

4. Site/shelter screening

There will not be any special screening for this project. There is natural screening on 2 sides of the property. The Guests will be sheltered in their working vehicles and have access to sanitation and refuse disposal containers will be available. Future amenities may include use of church shower, use of church kitchen, and meal provision.

5. Social and/or support services to be provided

We have met with CHA—Coordinated Housing Access and they have agreed to be the portal to our program. When KoK has an opening CHA will be notified and they will add the KoK SOS program to their list of temporary “housing” opportunities. Just prior to our opening we will meet again with CHA. Providence’s BOB—Better Outcomes Through Bridges—will provide social services to our Guests. A memorandum of understanding about services between King of Kings and Providence is included.

Providence’s Outreach Specialist, Mikaila Smith, will work with KoK members who agree to serve as contacts/mediators for our Guests. She will provide non-violent crisis Intervention training and will work with this team prior to the arrival of our first Guests.

6. Sanitary facilities

We will be renting a port-a-potty from American Sani-can and purchasing monthly service to maintain it. **We expect to have the potty serviced every two weeks but will modify that should the need arise.** We will also purchase a hand washing station as well a portable cigarette disposal container.

7. Solid Waste

We will be increasing our refuse containers, if needed, so that there is adequate space for refuse which is picked up weekly.

8. Storage arrangements for personal items.

SOS Guests will keep all their possessions in their vehicles.

9. Visitors/Guests

Guests will not be allowed to have any visitors on church property.

10. Pets

According to our SOS Application — Pets would be allowed. Guests agree to be responsible for any pets, keeping them on a leash at all times when not in the owners vehicle, and to clean up after them.
